326 Animals Vaccinated!

Every July for the past 13 years, SCHS has provided a vaccination clinic at no charge to the community. This year we administered vaccines to 234 dogs and 92 cats. These vaccines help prevent several highly contagious and potentially fatal diseases, as well as providing the rabies vaccine required to license all dogs.

In the past, the shelter has had to absorb all of the cost and because of this, we were unsure of our ability to continue providing this service to the community. However, with your donations we are optimistic about next year's clinic.
