#### **PET EDUCATION --**

What do you think when you hear those words? Leash training - housebreaking - obedience classes? Yes, those are things about which you need to "educate" your pet. But, what about Pet Education from the Human perspective?

What do we learn from our pets? Love, loyalty, responsibility, empathy, kindness and compassion. Wonderful qualities for adults and ones that we all want our children to learn. We teach them through example and a child also learns from their pet. Young children demonstrate a natural feeling for animals, which can be used to develop their empathy and compassion at an early age. This serves as a strong foundation for their future moral development.

Here is an excerpt from a study by the US National Parent-Teacher Association Congress in 1933: "Children taught to extend justice, kindness and mercy to animals become more just, kind and considerate in their relations to one another. Character training along these lines in youths will result in men and women of broader sympathies; more humane, more lawabiding and in every respect, more valuable - citizens."

During a pilot class for Humane Education, a Grade 10 participant stated: "In what other subject do you learn to love, care and protect?"

SCHS couldn't agree more and we love when families with young children adopt a pet knowing that they will be able to --"love them forever".

Nearly 8 million pets end up in shelters each year, separated from their families. Don't let your pet be a statistic! Here are seven simple steps from The Humane Society of the United States to help keep your pet a loved and loving member of your family.

- 1. Make sure your pet always wears up-to-date identification.
- Don't let behavior problems break up the family! Address problem behavior, consult with a professional if necessary, and take dogs and pups to training classes. Also learn how to prevent dog bites!
- 3. Visit the veterinarian at least once a year.
- 4. Spay or neuter your pet.
